

Obituary

George A. Pfister was born Feb. 22, 1915 on the family farm, rural Decorah. He attended rural school and graduated from Decorah High School in 1932 and Luther College in 1936. He toured Norway with the LC Band in 1936 under Dr. Sperati, after which he taught high school math and science classes in North Dakota and Iowa.

George entered the Army in 1941, served in the South Pacific, and was commissioned in 1943 and discharged in 1945. While in service he met and married Anna Cunningham, a nurse, with whom he had four children, all of whom graduated from Luther.

They returned to the family farm and George served in various civic and educational ventures. He sang second tenor in the Luren Singers for many years.

George died March 4th at Aase Haugen Home, Decorah. He was preceded by his parents, wife Anna in 2008, one sister and three brothers.

He is survived by four children, a sister ,and one brother Gordon – also a former Luren member.

A memorial service for George was held March 26th in Decorah.

Bill Fried became a member of Luren after invitations from fellow

singers in the Spring Grove area. He was born in Marshall MN, and has lived and worked in Moorhead and Spring Grove as a teacher of speech, theater and English. He has appeared in many roles at *Ye Olde Opera House* and *New Minowa Players* and been a long-time member of church choir.

Bill's wife Karen is President of the Sons of Norway Lodge in Spring Grove. They have two children: Chris and Kjersti.

Bill loves to sing and currently sings First Bass.

The Norwegian American Weekly of 13 April 2012 reported the death of Bjarne O. Anthonsen on March 29. Bjarne was born in Rødøy, Helgeland, Norway. He immigrated to Canada in 1955, then to California in 1960. He was very active in the Norwegian American community. He started the San Diego chorus in 1993, which will be hosting the PCNSA Sangerfest June 21-23, 2012. He also started the Men's Fish Club Odin in Vista, CA, a second in San Diego, and a third chapter in Mesa AZ. He wrote for the Western Viking, then also for the Norwegian American Weekly.

He was a very outgoing, lovable person with a big personality, the center of attention and life of the party. He had titled himself the King of Norway, and said it with gusto! He knew how to make you feel special whenever you were around him.

Bjarne is survived by his wife Judy, two sons and four stepsons. He had several grandchildren and greatgrandchildren, both here and in Norway.

PCNSA San Diego Sangerfest June 21 – 23, 2012

SEATTLE – Music is in the air and 'with a song in his heart' Harry is getting a bit restless these days, after all it is getting close to *Sangerfest* and he is really looking forward to that unique gathering of singers representing various Norwegian male choruses from the West Coast of the United States.

It isn't like he hasn't been there and had that experience before.

Actually, attending and singing in the *Sangerfest* Grand Concert come second nature to Harry and the excitement is reaching a big crescendo – as he puts it "the current one is always the best one."

No, Harry neither invented nor founded this special kind of gathering of singers.

The annual National Festivals, which took place in France in the 1790s, during the French Revolution, attracted thousands of singers to performances of huge mass choruses – *choeurs universels*. At the Paris festival, *l'Etre supreme* (The Supreme Existence), June 8, 1794, a mass mixed chorus of 2,400 voices performed.

Although on a somewhat smaller scale, Norway followed suit half a century later with The First Great Sangerfest (Den *Første* Sangerfest) on June 1, 1851 at Asker with participation of three choruses from Oslo and two from Drammen – a total of 173 singers performing under the direction of Johan Didrik Behrens, also known as the founder of Norway's first male chorus. Simultaneously Johan Gottfried Conradi arranged a Sangerfest in Tønsberg with participating choruses from the cities of Holmestrand, Larvik, Moss, Porsgrunn, Skien and

The first Norwegian Sangerfest in the USA took place in Philadelphia July 31 – August 2, 1887 with 123 active singers in attendance, 43 of whom represented Nordmændenes Sangforening of Chicago, featuring a complete program of Norwegian songs. John W. Colberg of Chicago directed the Grand Chorus.

On August 26, 1902 The Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association – PCNSA (Pacific Kystens Norske Sangerforbund) was founded in Seattle. Already the next year 1903 the Everett Norwegian Male Chorus, which incidentally was also organized the previous year, hosted the first PCNSA Sangerfest on August 1, 2 and 3, in that city. In addition to the host chorus, singing societies from Portland OR, Tacoma, Ballard and Seattle, performed admirably under Director-in-Chief, the beloved Carlo A. Sperati's capable leadership.

But Harry was still nowhere to be found...

So who is this Harry?

Harry Solheim is the son of Gustaf and Jenny Solheim who emigrated from Norway in 1914. Gustaf subsequently became a member of the Norwegian Male Chorus of Seattle. Born September 5, 1921 the 90-year-old Harry didn't actually come into the singers' picture until 1938 when the 17-year-old joined his father as a Seattle singer where his uncle Robert

Solheim also was a member. This writer had the pleasure of sitting along side 'Gus' for a number of years during Monday night rehearsals in the 1960s.

There was no PCNSA Sangerfest in 1938 and when the next one (1939) held in San Francisco came around Harry passed and actually attended his first Sangerfest in Tacoma in 1940, freely admitting that: "I really didn't

know my songs too well that year so I sort of faked it. ..." Things have changed over the years though. He now knows his songs very well and doesn't want or need the music when performing in concerts. Stranger yet, he actually watches the director! How do I know that? It isn't that he tells anyone; during my tenure as director of the Seattle NMC I have 'watched Harry watching me – watching Harry watching me - watching Harry watching me, etc'... But he will 'conform and hold a folder for the uniformity' show and during performances.

Family affair

Harry is proud of the fact that he sang in the Seattle chorus alongside both his father Gustaf and uncle Robert until the 1960s. He was no less proud when at the turn of the century his two sons Larry and Ken Solheim also joined the ranks of the Seattle singers. The latter, an outstanding Tuba player, also served as Assistant Director for the chorus and it gave Harry an extra thrill when Ken took the podium in Benaroya Hall conducting the July 2000 Sangerfest Grand Chorus in F. Bullard's "Winter Song".
