Dear Singer Brothers,

These few lines will be my last as President of the NSAA and Chairman of Sangerfest 2012; it has been my pleasure to serve you. On behalf of Bjornson Male Chorus and the Bjornson Ladies'Auxiliary, we are looking forward to meeting and greeting each and every one of you. We are grateful for all who are able to attend, and send our best wishes to those who cannot.

At this time I would like to mention a few gentlemen who are no longer with us, but when they were here they contributed much not only to their choruses but to the entire Scandinavian community.

Les Amack: Les sang Second Bass and was a fine musician in his own right. He had a fine ear for music and was a great asset in our party room at Sangerfest. Many of us will long remember how he lit up the party room at Madison's 2000 Sangerfest, playing one song after another on the piano. Many years ago, during one of our Spring Concerts at the Sacs Club, I came out with a one word solo on *I Guds Fri Natur*. Singing to a full house, I blared out, "*Priset*", before everyone else and as loud as I could.

I immediately wanted to fall through the stage and become invisible. Les was in the audience that evening and after the concert came over and said, "Roger, I know you felt terrible after that solo, but if it is any consolation you were right on pitch." As time passed we shared many laughs over that incident.

Earl Bichel: Earl, a strong bassbaritone was at one time Director of Bjørgvin Singing Society, a mixed chorus long since gone. Earl and I spent 10 years singing next to each other, and I most certainly became a better singer with Earl next to me. Earl had a rich and powerful voice and whenever I sang a wrong note he was always there to help me out. A very unselfish man, Earl was one of the Voices Wayne Spies wrote about that you would never forget.

Ray Nilsen: Ray and his accordion were present at every Norwegian and Scandinavian function imaginable. Ray sang with both Bjornson Male Chorus and Normennenes Singing Society, in addition to singing and being a member of Minnekirken. Ray had a fine Second Tenor voice and was called upon many times for solos. My wife Leslie and I have wonderful memories of singing and dancing to Ray's signature song *Nidelven*.

Glenn Heggem: A very difficullt name to put down as one that is no longer with us. Glenn, along with John Lee, Ray Dedricksen and at least a dozen more young fellows, came to Bjornson as teenagers still in Kelvyn Park High School during the late 1940s. The first person to greet me as I walked into Bjornson Male Chorus was Glenn, the chairman of the Music Committee at that time. Glenn also spent some time with the Edvard Grieg Chorus in Madison WI, a very close friend who will be sorely missed.

Another name I wish to mention is A. Peter Henriksen from the Normennenes Singing Society. Pete was as nice and friendly a man as you would ever want to meet. Always with a smile and kind word for everyone, he was the kind of man you felt you knew all your life.

We are saddened that they had to leave us. Perhaps their voices will be

heard again as they join all of the singers and directors that have preceded them in that much loftier chorus.

Information on the PCNSA Norway tour in 2013, with invited participation by the NSAA

(More detailed information will be available at NSAA Sangerfest 2012.)

There have been changes made from the previously published itinerary, in the January and February Sanger Hilsen.

The Tour will include 12 days of travel in Norway, not 14.

However, I am currently working on the possibility of NSAA members departing a few days earlier, staying a few days more in Norway, in connection with the American Coordination Council of Norway and the American Chamber Network's annual Independence Day celebration in Frogner Park. It may be possible for NSAA to perform on 30 June, in Frogner Park, where several thousand people are expected to celebrate. We will depart 28 June if this is the case.

Note: Such an extension will mean additional Tour cost, but it will be a real feather in our cap to celebrate our Independence Day in such a prestigious venue in front of so many people.

The PCNSA group will be arriving at Oslo's Gardermoen Airport, on the 1st of July. PCNSA is not able to depart before 30 June, from the west coast, as they have their Sangerfest concluding 29 June 2013.

We intend to add to the successes of NSAA previous tours of 1995, 1997 (joint with PCNSA) and 2005.

PCNSA San Diego Sangerfest June 21-23, 2012

'Company Man'

The 1940 Ballard High School graduate, Harry Solheim, is a dependable man who spent / was employed by the telephone company Pacific NW Bell for nearly 40 years (1946-82) before retiring. As a true Washingtonian he naturally 'spent a short time' at the Boeing Airplane

Company (1940-44) with the intervening years spent as a Medic in the US Army Air Corps.

'Dedication' and 'Depend-ability' most accurately describe Harry Solheim, the 74-year member who served the Seattle NMC as Secretary for over 30 years, was President four times and has worked on every imaginable committee, never afraid of going that extra step for the singers.

He was a driving force on the committee that organized 'The Annual Scandinavian Night' with the Seattle Symphony Orchestra and Norwegian Male Chorus and the late Baritone Olav Eriksen of the Norwegian Opera as guest soloist.

Harry was right there when a committee spearheaded by the NMC organized the successful Bicentennial European Ethnic Song Festival of Seattle (1976). Singers from nine choral groups representing countries different Finland. Germany, Latvia, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland – plus the 60-piece Ballard Youth Band in the elevating orchestra pit put on a spectacular concert in the old Seattle Opera House utilizing three stages and ending with a Mass Chorus of over 400 voices and the BYB performing "Give Me Your

Tired Your Poor," "This Is My Country," and "The Battle Hymn Of The Republic".

Age is but a number

While most choruses struggle to recruit new singers and grow, the PCNSA has compiled a trio of young-at-heart choruses. The San Diego *Mannskor* (CA) was organized in 1993 and is hosting its second Sangerfest this year (2012), the first one hosted in 1996. "Skagit Valley *Mannskor*" (WA) founded in 2000, hosted *Sangerfest* in 2005 and again in 2011. The youngest member is "Vestre Sund Mannskor" organized in 2003 in Poulsbo, WA.

Behind every successful man there is a strong woman – Harry's wife Tordis, herself an emigrant from Norway and a 'go-getter', is his steady companion and strongest supporter... The strength behind every Norwegian Male Chorus is a dedicated group of women and they make sure that "this year's *Sangerfest* will be the best one ever" put on by a small but sturdy group of Vikings "with numerous songs in their hearts."

It is doubtful that 2nd Bass Harry Solheim's record-setting impressive statistics will be surpassed in the nearest future, however Seattle has a couple of more spry singers.

Lars Steinnes joined the 2nd Tenor section in 1978 and can boast of attending 35 *Sangerfester*. He is also Seattle's "Grand Old Man" who turned '100 years young' on July 11, 2011. Lars emigrated from Finnøy outside Stavanger, Norway and came to Arlington SD via New York in 1929 before eventually landing in Seattle.

The 93-year-old 1st Tenor Hans Mueller started in 1988 in the Seattle Chorus, when he moved to Seattle. So far during his 25-year membership he logged in 16 *Sangerfester* as well as three PCNSA Concert Tours of

Norway.
