

A History of the Norwegian Glee Club of Minneapolis

The Norwegian Glee Club was formed on August 7, 1912, by the remaining members of two other Norwegian choruses: the Norwegian Good Templar Singing Society and the Hugnad Male Chorus. The original roster consisted of 26 members. Rehearsals began the next week and the first public appearance of the Glee Club was on November 10, 1912.

The club's first director was Carl G. O. Hanson who, except for an 18 month absence, served as director until 1944. Other notable directors were Robert Andersen (1948-1953), who was also a concert violinist with the Minneapolis Symphony Orchestra; Fred Wick (1953-1964), who was also the Director-in-Chief of Norwegian Singers Association of America for many years; and Rolf Graning (1964-1980; 1983-1990). Arden Haug became director in September 1990. Current director is Carsten Slostad, who replaced Tom Ohnesorge.

Since both prior choruses had been members of the NSAA and had attended the 1912 Sangerfest in Fargo ND, the Glee Club immediately joined the NSAA and attended its next biennial Sangerfest in 1914. The club has been active at every national Sangerfest held by the NSAA since then. National Sangerfests have been held in Salt Lake City, New York. Chicago, Rapid City and many other cities throughout the Upper Midwest. The club has been the host chorus at several of these events. The club was represented also in Seattle in 1989 at the Sangerfest of the Pacific Coast

Norwegian Singers Association, celebrating the centennial of the State of Washington and the Seattle Chorus.

In addition to the many singing engagements at lodges, retirement homes, dinner meetings and patriotic celebrations (both Norwegian and American), the club has sung at many Spring and Advent concerts with other Minneapolis Norwegian choruses. It has also attended all national and local Sangerfests sponsored by the Twin City Scandinavian Center at Augsburg College.

The Norwegian Glee Club of Minneapolis plans to bring the musical treasures of Norway to the American public for many years to come, reminding us of our great Scandinavian heritage!







Bob was 86 years old and had performed with us as recently as three weeks before his death. Bob sang second tenor with the Chorus for over 30 years. He attended 16 Sangerfests and was the recipient of Bronze, Silver and Gold NSAA Sangerfest medals. Bob liked to joke that he was in the Chorus from the very beginning as he was born in 1925, the same year the Chorus was formed.

Bob's grandparents immigrated from Bergen, Norway. He was the youngest son of six children born to Hans Olaf Jarlsberg and Stella (Netland) Jarlsberg. Bob enlisted in the U.S. Navy two weeks prior to his graduation from Cambridge High School so his father had to pick up his diploma! He served on the U. S. George from July 1943 until his discharge in February 1946, seeing duty from Great Lakes to Okinawa. On April 30, 1949, Bob married





Patricia Krening in Racine. Pat preceded him in death in August 2003. Bob is survived by their two sons and a daughter, four grandchildren and two greatgrandchildren.

Bob was an avid bowler, wood worker and a big fan of his nephew, race car driver Matt Kenseth. Services were held at Willerup United Methodist Church in Cambridge, the oldest Norwegian Methodist church in the world. It was founded in 1852 by Christian Barnes Willerup, a Norwegian circuit rider for the Methodist Church. The Chorus was honored to sing at Bob's service. We will all miss his pleasant smile and strong voice.

On a happier note, the Chorus held its annual Christmas Potluck on December 6, and on December 13 we sang a Christmas concert at Prairie Park Retirement Apartments in Madison. We will take a short break for the holidays and return in January to continue our review of the music for Sangerfest 2012. The next day, November 28th found us in an informal rehearsal/concert at The Washington Crossing retirement community here in Sioux Falls. We had been there earlier in the Fall, and were invited to return as Christmas approached. We presented some

concert pieces, but also included a number of sing-along carols.

At this writing, two more concerts are scheduled. First, on Sunday, December 4th, for a third year in a row, we will present traditional Norwegian and holiday music at the Waterford-at-all-Saints retirement community. In past years, "standing room only" prevailed in the chapel. The second event, on December 8th, will be a return visit to the South Dakota Penitentiary. This is a site we visit twice a year in support of religious services.

It's the music that brings us together, but as likely it's the camaraderie that keeps us so. Our preparation and presentation of our annual Lutefisk supper proved to be very successful, by many measures. We served about 550 paying patrons. Their loyalty is noteworthy considering the distances some travel in order to partake.

Maybe a "first" this year; despite our planning for increased customer numbers we RAN OUT of Lutefisk, and had to rapidly recover by calling upon some local suppliers to supplement us. All reports later from patrons were that they got their "fill." This month, we will again combine our anniversary observance with our Christmas dinner and party. The Norse Glee Club is observing its 83rd year since charter.

In all, the Fall has been music filled, as we were initially challenged but then pretty much satisfied with our mastery of it. We have been very gratified by each audience's reception of our efforts. For the new year, we look forward to the possibilities. Most notably, as our Sangerfest preparations begin in earnest, and

travel and accommodations plans are made.




