In June 1988 they moved to Bettendorf IA for the position of Dean at Augustana College, Rock Island IL. Another move in 1998 took them to Chicago where Arne became Director for Colleges and Universities for the ELCA. He retired in 2008 and they moved to the Twin Cities in 2010. They have a son Jon, who is an optometrist in the US Navy, a daughter Anne who is a speech pathologist in St. Louis Park MN and two grandchildren Erik and Adin. Arne is the only family member who came to America, leaving many relatives. His mother died this past summer at 102. Arne loves to sing, and we are so happy that he chose to do that with us.


