It is a special privilege for our choirs to hold this event since the organizational meeting of the Sioux Valley Singers was held in Canton, on April 9, 1913. Members of the NSAA began discussing the idea of forming a Sioux Valley group while returning from the National Sangerfest in Fargo, in 1912. Fred Wick was elected Director-in-Chief of the Sioux Valley Singers Assoc., with the first sangerfest held in Sioux City IA on Aug. 27th, 1913.

The members of our chorus and ladies auxiliary are busy preparing for this special event. As we all know it seems a date that seems so far off, all too soon becomes a memory. We hope our preparations for this event will make it a very special memory for members of the Sioux Valley!

I have also included a translation of an article written about 1914 about the organization of the Sioux Valley Singers Assoc., translated by Julian Holter, Grieg Chorus, Canton SD, and John Kvidal, Nordic Male Chorus, Sioux City IA. For those who may enjoy it, I have also included the Norwegian text and the first sangerfest program from 1913.

CENTENNIAL YEAR SIOUX VALLEY SINGERS

Jerry Holter of the Grieg Male Chorus in Canton submitted both an article written by Martin Bergh, a past President of the *Sioux Valley Norske Sangerforbund*, and a translation of a part of the article, done by Julian Holter and John Kvidal. Also, Rodney Hoff of the Norse Glee Club has sent some historical items, with intention to submit others for future issues. We thank all of these men for the effort and work they have done already.

The translation from Norwegian follows as submitted:

The Big Sioux River flows along the Eastern side of South Dakota from North to South, forming a boundary between South Dakota on the West, Minnesota and Iowa on the East.

Scandinavians settled here by the thousands. Aberdeen lies a little northwest of the source of the Big Sioux, while Watertown is the northern-most town by its shore. A hundred miles south the river meanders through Sioux Falls, the state's largest city. Twenty miles farther south is Canton, the most Norwegian city in South Dakota, and almost a hundred miles south the Big Sioux

empties into the mighty Missouri by Sioux City IA. Madison SD is northwest of Sioux Falls and is perhaps the next most-Norwegian city. In a southeasterly direction from Sioux City is Fort Dodge, and directly west in the Sate of Nebraska is the great city of Omaha.

Norwegian and Scandinavian Singing Societies have been organized in these cities since the 1890s. Interest in music and song has grown from the heavy work days of the immigrants to the more leisurely opportunities of the present (1913).

A national gathering every other year did not satisfy these eager and enthusiastic singers. They wanted to meet more often. Thus arose a merger of those choruses, drawn together by geography and neighborhood. The Sioux Valley Singers Association was organized, which included singing societies in the cities mentioned above in South Dakota, Nebraska and Iowa.

On April 9, 1913, the director of the Minnehaha Mandskor called meeting of delegates in Canton SD. The Association included these societies: Normendennes Sangforening (now Nordic Male Chorus), Sioux City IA; Minnehaha Mandskor, Sioux Falls SD; and Grieg Sangforening, Canton SD, and at a later date Nor. Omaha NB. Fred Wick of Sioux Falls was elected Director-in-Chief. A resolution was adopted at the same meeting to hold Sioux Valley Sangerfests every other year, beginning on August 27, 1913, with the first Sangerfest to be held in Sioux City IA.

Hoff's submittal is the Minutes of the business meeting of the Sioux Valley Association in 1935, during the depths of the Great Depression.

Sioux City, Ia. Sept. 14, 1935

The Biennial meeting of the Sioux Valley Singers Association was held in the Martin Hotel in Sioux City, IA.

President Christ Dahl opened the meeting at 2:30 p.m. Resignation of the Secretary made it necessary for the President to read the Minutes of the last meeting. The Minutes were approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was read by the Assistant Treasurer, Engal Lonseth of Sioux City, as follows:

June 23rd, 1933, On deposit in defunct bank, First Trust and Savings Bank of Sioux City IA. \$13.36. Books closed on June 23rd, 1933.

Treasurer's report for 1933: Rec'd from Norse Glee Club, Sioux Falls, June 24th, \$3.50; Normenennes Singing Society, Sioux City IA, June 24th, \$3.00. First dividend from defunct bank, Dec. 31, 1932, \$4.07. Second dividend from defunct bank, Dec. 7, 1934, \$0.68. Third dividend from defunct bank, Jan. 5, 1935 \$2.03. Cash on hand, 22 cents, leaving a total of \$13.50 as a balance. Motion was made and seconded, carried that the above minutes stand approved as read.

Pres. Dahl asked for tabled questions of the last meeting; none were offered.

Pres. Dahl introduced our national secretary, Th. F. Hammann; he gave a very interesting and enlightening talk.

Officers elected:

President, M. P. Juel, Canton SD V. Pres., L. R. Haug, Beresford SD Sec., Bent Stolpe, Sioux City IA. Treas., Engal Lonseth, Sioux City IA Director-in-Chief, Prof. Clifford Olson, Sioux Falls SD; Asst. Director, A. J. Jarde, Baltic SD Delegates were instructed to assemble in regards to the logical place to hold the next convention. Canton was the next highly favored. Decision was made to hold said convention at the fore-mentioned city in the year of 1937.

Motion made that the meeting be adjourned. Carried. Acting Secretary, Bent Stolpe, Sioux

City IA.

Dak., og deres Virksomhed er vel kjendt inden de norske skandinaviske og Sangerforbund i Amerika. Det nordvestlige Sangerforgund har flere Gange holdt sine Sangerfester in Sioux Falls, og Sioux City og Omaha har ogsaa underholdt disse store Sangermøde i forbigange Aar. Det fine Presbanner der nu eies og opbevares of Minnehaha Mandskor i Sioux Falls, har saaledes været Gjendstand for Sangkampe ved flere of disse Møder.

Interessen for Musik og Sang har vokset, eftersom Folket har steget fra Udvandringsperiodens strenge Arbeidsdage til Nutidens mere magelige Leiligheder. En National forsamling hvert andet Aar tilfredsstillede ikke de ivrige og enthusiastiske Sangere. De følte oftere Trangen af Møder Sammenkomster. Derfor har der opstaaet i passende Lokaliteter underordnede Sammenslutning saadanne Sangkor, some følte sig draget sammen geografisk i Henseende, af Naboskab, osv.
