## LUREN SINGING SOCIETY Decorah IA

Our Mother Day joint concert with the Luther College Norsemen, two male groups from Decorah High School and the Viking Voices from the Decorah Middle School was very well attended and widely praised. It was noted that seven members of the Norsemen had been members of the Decorah High School male chorus just last year. About 200 male voices were in the combined chorus for the final two selections of the program.

Dean Beckman, Viking Voices conductor, gave a fine tribute to this kind of program, pointing out that the older groups serve as fine mentors and examples for the upcoming classes.

The free-will offering, divided for four charities of the area, totaled over \$1300.

Rev. Ole Winter, a now retired pastor of Decorah Lutheran Church, submitted a fine Letter to the Editor, which carried the headline: õConcert: Nothing like it in the state (world).ö

I quote, in part, õI wonder? Is there any other community in the state and nation that could present a musical concert with nearly 200-male voices pleasing the ear and the heart? Maybe you know of some other such cityí

Personally, I was the most pleased and pleasantly surprised to hear the young voices of men from the Decorah Middle and High School. The future of male chorus music is in good; those young men outdid themselves. God was praised. We were delighted.ö

Pastor Winter had much more to say that was praiseworthy and positive. We commend this type of event for other groups to emulate.

We are scheduled to sing for the Sons of Norway Lodge in LaCrosse on Thursday, June 5<sup>th</sup>. In effect, this is an extra rehearsal prior to Sangerfest. A special treat is the pie and ice cream to be served following the concert.

Speaking of Sons of Norway, our own Valdres Lodge in Decorah held its meeting May 20<sup>th</sup> with emphasis on the Bicentenary of Norway& Constitution. Nine Luren members sang the special song *Det går et festtog gjennom landet* as part of the program. We&l include it in some of our other concerts too, and during the various events at Sangerfest.

We held our elections for the coming year in May; we'll ratify them in September to make the process more official.

After Sangerfest and before the County Fair food stand July 8-12, we will entertain visiting choruses from Norway: on June 30<sup>th</sup> at Decorah Lutheran Church the Bodø Domkor in an 8 p.m. concert, for which Luren is to do a few opening selections, and a Swedish choir on July 2<sup>nd</sup>, for which the details are unclear. We were to have the Fuglset chorus from Molde, Norway on July 1<sup>st</sup>, but they are to be in Westby WI instead. So some of us may drive over and join them in one or two numbers.

After the County Fair some of us will help serve the Community Meal offered at First Lutheran Church on the third Thursday, July 17<sup>th</sup>. Then we do our Nordic Fest events July 24-26. Our Friday evening mini-concert will be at the Courthouse Square at 8 p.m.

It is not yet officially approved, but we have begun planning for a concert tour to Norway for June 2015. There is an itinerary and preliminary pricing already proposed.

Finally, the promised interview with a **new member. Tom Stene** was born at Alma MI, the third of five sons of a cabinet-maker father and music teacher mother. His paternal great grandparents came from Norway. As a young family, they moved to Joliet, Montana, where the boys were all home-schooled all the way through high school. Tom did attend Millar College of the Bible in Canada for one year.

Tom attended our Christmas concert at Caledonia last December as a guest of the Bicknese family and expressed interest in joining our group. Well, he finally got the chance and is planing to be at Sangerfest this June!

Tom works in the West Union area. He sings baritone and plays trombone, and has studied piano under his mother who used the Suzuki method. So Tom is quite an accomplished musician with a wide vocal range and instrumental skills. He is enthusiastic about the Luren group. We hope he can stick around with us for a long time.


frightening sounds through the large cottonwood leaves. Then my Dad would pick me up and simply tell me the trees were singing to me.

## NORSE GLEE CLUB Sioux Falls SD

At this writing, the orehearsal seasonö (Jan-Jun) is coming to a close, and SangerFest 2014 is upon us. On May 12<sup>th</sup> the Sioux Valley Singers were in rehearsal in Sioux City, Iowa, hosted by the Nordic Male Chorus, and on June 9<sup>th</sup> a final joint rehearsal will be held here in Sioux Falls, hosted by the Mandskor. Needless to say, we are hopeful about the adequacy of our preparations. While SangerFest 2014 has been our õtotalö musical focus to-date, meetings are being held, and plans are well underway for SangerFest 2016 here in Sioux Falls.

With great pleasure we welcomed a new member into the Club. Mr. Ben Carson was sponsored into membership, and voted into membership by acclimation. He has become a valuable voice in the 2<sup>nd</sup> tenor section.

It is with continued sadness, however, that I report the passing of yet another of our long-time members. Dr. Arthur Olsen died on May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2014. He was 84 years of age. He had been in failing health for some time, and was surrounded by his family at the time of his passing. Art and his wife, Ruth, had been married just a few months shy of 60 years. Members of our Glee Club and the Sioux Falls Mandskor were privileged to honor him at his memorial service on Monday, May 26<sup>th</sup>. We offered *Den store hvide flok*.

Art first earned a degree in philosophy at St. Olaf College, and then he earned a degree in theology from Luther Seminary. He was ordained in the Lutheran Church in 1975. He continued his academic

pursuits at Harvard Divinity School where he earned a Doctor of Theology degree. In 2002, Luther Seminary awarded him the Faithfulness in Ministry Cross.

During a 49-year tenure at Augustana College, he taught courses in religion, philosophy, and ethics. In recent years he was instrumental in the presentation of a course in the Principles of Biomedical Ethics. He additionally served in several administrative positions, including that of Provost for a time.

Art was a tireless proponent of his Norwegian heritage. In 2008, he was presented the St. Olav Medal by the Norwegian Consulate in recognition of his work to preserve Norwegian heritage, and to strengthen the bonds between Norwegian-Americans and Norway. He was a member of our Norse Glee Club for about 20 years, having attended seven SangerFests.

In Artøs honor, scholarship funds have been established at both Augustana College and the Nordland Heritage Foundation.



swimming pool. The Bad now includes whirlpool/hot tub facilities and exercise equipment. Its design was inspired by the old Roman baths.
