EDVARD GRIEG CHORUS Madison WI Celebrating our 90th Anniversary in 2015

On March 15th the Edvard Grieg Chorus celebrated our history. We began the day with a concert we called *Grieg with a Bit o' Blarney* at the Stoughton Opera House. The performance included readings, poetry, Norwegian jokes and stories, and musical solos. Assistant Director Linda Svanoe and accompanist Linda

Johnson performed a complicated and beautiful duet on recorder and violin. The audience joined in on several sing-a-longs including *My Wild Irish Rose* and *When Irish Eyes are Smiling*.

The Chorus' selections included Danny Boy, Hils fra mig der Hjemme and Song for the Unsung Hero. David Druckenbrod and the Chorus concluded the show with An Irish Blessing that includes the poignant ending, "May God hold you in the hollow of

His hand until we meet again."

Following the concert, members of the Chorus and their spouses traveled to the Stoughton Country Club for our 90th Anniversary Founders Day celebration. After an excellent meal and anniversary cake dessert, Chorus historian Al Swain presented his review of the Chorus' 90-year history.

The Chorus was organized on January 26, 1925 as the Grieg Mannskor, one of three Norwegian choruses in Madison and at least six others in Wisconsin. By the time we changed our name to the Edvard Grieg Chorus in 2002, we were the last surviving Norwegian singing group in Wisconsin,

Over our 90-year history we have had twelve Directors. Our current director, Mark Everson, who joined his grandfather in the Chorus, began his service as our accompanist in 1976 and became our Director in 1984. Mark's 31 years as our musical leader ranks him as the Chorus' longest serving director. Over this same period we have had nine accompanists.

The Chorus has hosted many visiting choruses from Norway as well as performing for Norwegian royalty and dignitaries. The Chorus sang for Prince Olav and Princess Martha when they visited Madison in 1939 and for King Olav's son, Prince Harald, in 1965. In 1994 the Chorus

performed at a reception at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in honor of the Prime Minister of Norway Gro Harlem Brundtland's Honorary Doctor's degree.

The Chorus attended its first Sangerfest held in Chicago in 1926. In 1932 the Chorus hosted the national Sangerfest, the first broadcast by shortwave radio to Norway. The Chorus hosted the Midwest Division Sangerfests in 1955 and 1963 and the NSAA Sangerfests in 1974, 1990, 2000, and 2010.

Next on our schedule will be several performances for *Syttende Mai* week-end in Stoughton including the grand opening of *Livsreise* (*Life's Journey*), the new Norwegian Cultural Center.

A standing ovation ended the evening's festivities. Coffee "and" was served to end the evening.

Our next outing will be Sunday, April 19th at Bethesda Retirement Home in Chicago. Bjornson has been appearing there since our very existence. It's been three years since our last appearance there, so it will be like "old home week."

We'll be singing Friday, May 15th at *Minnekirken* on Logan Square, celebrating *Syttende Mai* once again. Can't say enough about the wonderful experience of greeting old friends for an evening of fellowship.

The refreshments following the service are first class! Then on Friday, June 12th, our Spring Concert and dinner will be will be held at the Avalon Banquets. We're working on the program now, so more on that night in the next issue.

LUREN SINGING SOCIETY Decorah IA

We enjoyed favorable weather for our Lenten appearances. Prior to the service at Old East Paint Creek Lutheran Church at rural Waukon on Mar. 4th, most of us shared in the soup supper. The service itself was a full worship service with Holy Communion.

This congregation is one of the oldest Norwegian Lutheran congregation west of the Mississippi, with the first services held in 1851. Pastor C. L. Clausen came from southern Wisconsin to visit the Painted Creek settlement. The church building is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Although not on a typical Wednesday evening, we did sing a joint concert at Rushford Lutheran Church on March 20th with the Valley Male Chorus from Hull IA. Their group was on a weekend tour, mostly in Iowa. One of their members is the father of a former Luther student, who had taken voice lessons from Dr. Judisch and sang with Luren last year.

The Valley Male Chorus' objective was to raise money for Hope Haven, a project that provides services to persons with disabilities there at Hull and around the world.

More recently, on Apr. 12th, we sang at West Clermont Lutheran Church for that congregation's

Centennial. The congregation is a daughter to another very old congregation, East Clermont Lutheran, which traces its origins to the early 1850s.

We are looking forward to hosting "Cantus," the Norwegian women's chorus that sang the opening number in the Disney movie "Frozen." This group is coming to our community on Thursday, Apr. 23rd and will sing in concert at 6:30 p.m. at First Lutheran Church.

Our now annual joint concert with The Norsemen, the freshmen chorus from Luther College, is set for May 10 at Decorah Lutheran Church at 7 p.m.

Many of these young men go on to sing with other choral groups at Luther. It is a delight to follow these young men in their musical careers and to have had a small part in what is often a professional musical pursuit.

Prior to our Norway tour, we will do a bon voyage concert at Hesper Lutheran Church on June 7th. This congre-gation is observing its 150th anniversary this year. The following even-ing will be our final rehearsal before leaving for Norway on June 16th. Our itinerary is included elsewhere in this issue.

We have experienced two losses in our Luren family since the last report.

Mrs. Betty (Rikansrud) Nelson, widow of Dr. David T. Nelson, died of an aortic aneurism on March 8th. We sang for her memorial service on March 17th (ironically the anniversary date of Luren's founding).
