Walter Tore Ulleberg Alfred Paulsen Terry Walter The 49<sup>th</sup> Biennial Sioux Valley Sangerfest Grand Concert was presented at 5 p.m., Saturday, June 13, 2015, at Morningside Lutheran Church, Sioux City. It was a great opportunity to hear the combined 70-voice male choruses with members from Sioux City, Sioux Falls and Canton.

The well-received program included a variety of American and Norwegian music, spirituals, show tunes, and Scandinavian classics.

Nordic Male Chorus hosts the event every eight years. Chuck Schuett, our Nordic director, conducted a large portion of the concert as Associate Director of the singers along with Terry Walter, Director-in-Chief. Deanna Wehrspann was accompanist and Nick Anderson of the host chorus was soloist.

The late Harlan õBudö Dawson of Nordics was honored in the Roll Call of Departed Members. Schuett and Gary Munson were awarded 20+ Sangerfest pins, and Ken Kathol and Larry Weil earned pins for five Sangerfests. First time attendees from the host group were the Rev. Leland Schmidt, Charles Horkey and Dave Carlson, as well as Nick Anderson.

(The following is excerpted from the Sangerfest program.) Norwegian and Scandinavian singing societies organized in the Sioux Valley area in the early 1890s. They were part of a national organization which gathered on even-numbered years for a National Sangerfest. Our choruses desired to meet more frequently. The director of the Minnehaha Mandskor of Sioux Falls organized a meeting of delegates from area choruses to meet in Canton on April 9, 1913. Minnehaha Mandskor, Normendennes

Sangforening (now the Nordic Male Chorus) of Sioux City and Grieg Sangforening of Canton were represented at this assembly. They resolved to unite for a Sioux Valley Sangerfest every odd-numbered year, beginning in 1913. Nor Singing Society of Omaha soon joined the group. Fred Wick of Sioux Falls was elected the first Director-in-Chief for the first SVSA Sangerfest, held in Sioux City Aug. 27, 1913.

## EDVARD GRIEG CHORUS Madison, WI

Our Chorus is currently on summer recess, but a group of members sang the National Anthem at the Mallards baseball game on August 3. It was an exciting game, and the Mallards prevailed over the Blue Anchors of Alexandria, MN 6 to 5.

Currently there is a development that is of particular interest to the Chorus and the Norwegian community of southwest Wisconsin. Two years ago Little Norway in Blue Mounds was forced to close for financial reasons. The 40-acre property depicting the life of early Norwegian settlers opened to the public in 1937.

It included an authentic stave church, a collection of log buildings, a natural spring and picnic grounds. The museum and buildings displayed over 7,000 Norwegian artifacts. The owner of the popular tourist attraction indicated that the reason for the closure was that the costs of maintaining the buildings and related displays significantly exceeded annual revenues.

An attempt was made to sell the operation to a non-profit organization, but that failed. The future of the stave church is of particular interest. It was originally built in Orkdal, Norway and then taken apart and shipped to the United States as part of the Norwegian exhibit at the 1893 Worldøs Columbian Exhibition in Chicago. The church was based on a stave church in Gol, Norway and was constructed in just three months along a fjord west of Trondheim and north of Oslo.

After the six-month Worldøs Fair in Chicago, the building was

disassembled and moved to the Wrigley estate along the north shore of Lake Geneva, Wisconsin. In 1935 the church was disassembled again and shipped to the Blue Mounds property of Osten Olson Haugen who had immigrated in the mid 1800¢s, and it quickly became the centerpiece of Little Norway.

The stave church is on the move In April a delegation from again! Orkdal visited Little Norway to evaluate the condition of the church and determine the feasibility of taking it apart one more time and returning it After 122 years, the to Norway. building was found to be structurally In fact, the craftsmen sound. discovered the sequence of numbers inside the church that were used in the previous disassembly and reassembly projects. The City Council of Orkdal agreed to move forward with the effort and provided \$800,000 for the purchase of the building, disassembly and shipping to Norway.

The Edvard Grieg Chorus has had a long and special relationship with Little Norway. Over the past several years our Chorus was invited to perform for the Little Norway Summer Solstice celebration that always included a picnic, the parade of Norwegian costumes and the traditional dance around the bonfire. Our Chorus recently received an invitation to sing for the ofarewell gatheringö on Sunday, September 6. There will be an õofficialö delegation coming from Orkdal for this special program. Disassembly of the stave church will begin the next day. What a great way to say goodbye to this historic gem.

## LUREN SINGING SOCIETY Decorah IA

A death notice in the Minneapolis Star-Tribune around July 1<sup>st</sup> caught my eye. It told of the death of a former Luren member, Rev. David A. Lee on June 26<sup>th</sup> at Southport NC.

Pastor Lee was born 27 Nov. 1930 in Hankow China to missionary parents. His mother was one of several daughters in the Nummedal family who grew up in the Kenyon MN area and married pastors who went out to China.

David graduated from St. Olaf College in 1954, the same year he and Lorraine Myli were married. After he graduated from Luther Seminary, he accepted a Call to the Burr Oak-Hesper Lutheran parish north of Decorah, where he served 1958-62. During those years he sang tenor with the Luren Singers.

The Lee family returned to serve as missionaries in Hong Kong from 1964-73 and 74-78, as well as mission interpreters during two furlough stints.

When they returned from Hong Kong, they served parishes in Virginia and West Virginia.

The highlight of our summer was the concert tour to Norway, which is featured in this issue. We had *fint vær* (fine weather) with just a couple of cool and cloudy days in the Trondheim area. We had no rain in Bergen!

It is risky to schedule such a tour in the time that school gets out and the vacations begin. But the local hosts did a fine job of advertising and the attendance at our five concerts was excellent and enthusiastic. We were warmly welcomed by our hosts

Each of us on the tour would select a different favorite place, concert or other event. The welcome events by several host choruses were delightful, and the meals, hospitality and fellowship were outstanding. Many pictures were taken and not just of fjords and waterfalls. (We did not eat fish at every meal!)

We had only a few casualties in the health category, and they came later in the tour. A few of us stayed some extra days; most of us added one day in Reykjavik, Iceland on our way back.

Upon landing in Minneapolis, we were õgreetedö by an announcement that the airport was in a severe weather area. Fortunately, by the time we got our baggage, went through customs and boarded our Hawkeye Stages bus for Decorah, the system had passed.

A week later we were busy getting ready for our big fund-raising project of manning the Luren Food Stand at the Fair. Truly we had õfairö weather with favorable temperatures. Profits look to be above previous years, so we should be able to afford Sangerfest 2016 in Sioux Falls.

We were õDancing with the Trollsö during Nordic Fest in late July. We had our usual spot for the Opening on Thursday evening, then our outdoor concert on Friday evening, and float in the Saturday morning parade.
