# HIS LIFE AND CAREER His boyhood and education

David E. Judisch was the sixth child of a German background farm couple, born at Buck Creek, rural Sumner IA. Two sisters, a brother, and two other sisters preceded him.

He attended a rural school, which had no music program except - as Dave said, õto crank up a Victrola and sing along with Burl Ives,ö then High School at Readlyn, now part of the Wapsie Valley High School, and went on to the University of Iowa, where he

received his Bachelorøs degree and Master of Fine Arts in Vocal Performance and Pedagogy. Later, in 1979, he received his Doctorate under the tutelage of Professor Herald Stark, himself a Nebraska farm boy.

Prof. Stark did not want to see his pupil go into high school teaching; he wanted Dave, who had signed a contract with the Lake City IA Schools because he needed a job, to pursue a career in professional singing.

Prof. Stark knew Weston Noble and encouraged Prof. Noble to contact the

young music teacher and encourage him to come to Luther College. This meant Dave had to break his contract with the Lake City Schools. Dave and wife Gail arrived in Decorah in 1974 with their older son Nathanael, who was born at Iowa City.

Prof. Judisch had known David Greedy from work together in opera at the University. Dr. Greedy was also on the faculty at Luther, and had succeeded Wesley Abbott as Director of the Luren Singing Society.

In the fall of 1975 Dr. Greedy and õJackö Nelson, then President of the Luren Singers, contacted Prof. Judisch to become Lurenøs new director, thus beginning a remarkable career that is still unfolding.

## His career with Luren and NSAA.

As a Norwegian-American male chorus, Luren had sung primarily songs of Scandinavian background. For many years, many of the members understood and/or spoke Norwegian, so there were several õtutorsö for the German-background director, especially in how to pronounce the words. But he was the professional/professor who could teach the men how to sing those words properly.

Membership in Luren grew. There had already been concert tours to Norway in 1969 and 1973; other tours were arranged for different areas of the Upper Midwest. Soon another tour was planned for Norway in 1983, the year Luren reached its peak in membership, the mid 80s.

Luren continued to take part in the biennial NSAA Sangerfests, hosting in 1976, 1986, 1996 and 2006. Soon its directors skills were recognized by the NSAA voting membership, and he was elected Associate Director-in-Chief in 1980 and 1982, and became

Director-in-Chief in 1984, a position he has held to the present time. With a Music Committee including directors of other NSAA choruses, he has helped select Sangerfest pieces, arranged for orchestra and soloists, and shared helpful instructions on how to perform the selections, leading rehearsals and conducting much of the program. On occasion he himself has been a featured baritone soloist.

Under Dr. Judischøs leadership, Luren has returned to Norway for concert tours in 1983, 1993, 2001, and 2015. In addition, he was director for tours to Norway and other Scandinavian countries by members of NSAA choruses, with other singers from the Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association and other groups, in 1995, 1997 and 2005. Each of the tours has been planned to include not only the major cities, but also places less often visited by touring musical groups.

In 1989, Luren arranged a concert tour to the West Coast, with several major venues on the way to and from Seattle, including the Air Force Academy chapel and Temple Square in Salt Lake City. In Seattle, Luren joined in the Pacific Coast Sangerfest, honoring the Centennial of the host chorus and the State of Washington. Dr. Judisch was the featured soloist for the event.

## His Career at Luther and Beyond

Because of their mutual interest in opera, Dr. Judisch and Dr. Greedy collaborated in establishing the Dorian Opera Theatre at Luther College. He sang the lead role of Edvard Grieg in Song of Norway in 1995 and 1996 in conjunction with Decorahøs Nordic Fest. In 1999 he played the role of Tevye in Fiddler on the Roof. He has continued to teach voice lessons to college students and community peo-

ple, and in his recent retirement from the College he has established a studio in his home for private voice lessons.

Dr. Judisch served three separate years as head of the Luther College Music Department, another 17 years as Associate Head of the Department, and Head of Voice and Opera for 16 of those years.

For several years he was Director of the Senior Choir at Decorah Lutheran Church. Currently, he serves on the Social Concerns Committee of Good Shepherd Lutheran, and is a leader of a Community Meal held twice each month at First Lutheran Church.

Dr. David and Gail (Haberkamp) Judisch were married in 1968. They have two sons. Nathanael is married and lives in the Philadelphia area with his wife and two children. Aaron, who was born in Decorah, is a professional opera singer, currently living in Germany. Gail is an RN, who has worked at Luther College in the Infirmary.

# NORDIC MALE CHORUS Sioux City IA

The Nordics have begun rehearsals on music for Sangerfest 2016, in the

meantime marking this same year the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Chorus. This and the responsibility of the members and auxiliary on registration and greetings for the June 9-11 event in Sioux Falls.

The origin of Sioux Cityøs oldest singing group came from eight young Norwegian immigrants who formed the Fram Singing Society. Their performances were mostly in homes.

In 1891, the Chorus known as Normendenes Sangforening emerged with its first director N. S. Orningaard, who served the singers for over 20 years. A similar group was organized the same year in Sioux Falls; both were charter members in a parent organization called the Norwegian Singers Association. From this came biennial conventions featuring music concerts to be known as Sangerfests.

The first national Sangerfest was held in Sioux Falls in 1892. Two years later, Sioux City hosted the national event in the first of several Sangerfests through the years.

It was in 1913 that the Chorus was host for the newly organized Sioux Valley Singers Association, composed of member choruses from Sioux City, Sioux Falls and Canton, performing singing sessions in the off-years between national meets.

No formal celebration for the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary is planned, but the Nordics may mark the Anniversary at a later date.
