

After three years of military service during WW II, and graduate school at Vermillion SD, he began his teaching career at Harmony MN in 1950, then to Richfield MN, retiring in 1987.

Lee sang with the Norwegian Glee Club for 30 years, serving most recently as Glee Club Treasurer. He was honored with the NSAA Gold with Diamond medal for attending 20 Sangerfests a few years ago. He made

two trips to Norway including the NSAA Concert Tour in 1985.

Lee died July 27th. His funeral was held at *Mindekirken* Aug. 2nd with his burial at Woodville WI.

One of Nordic's tours was to Russia, on which Andrew was Dr. Nobleøs personal valet.

Although his BA was in Elementary Education, Andrew went to work for Lutheran Brotherhood, serving for five years on the West Coast, then returning to the Midwest. While living in Cedar Rapids he was introduced to Carrie Willett, whom he married May 28, 2006.

Andrew and Carrie became parents to Kyle and Karna. The family moved to Northfield MN, where Andrew was employed with Thrivent Financial.

On March 12, 2016, Andrew was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic

Leukemia (ALL). For 16 months he was treated with chemo, radiation and stem cell transplant by the Mayo Medical personnel.

Andrew died July 28th at Rochester. The celebration of his too-short life was held at Trinity Lutheran Church in Spring Grove MN Aug.1st. Along with nine hymns by the congregation, Luren Singers sang õWe Shall Walkö and õJesus Loves Me,ö and õAftensangö at the graveside.

Gordon W. Olson, former director of Nordkap and Assistant Director of NSAA, died May 8, 2017 at home in Golden Valley, a suburb of Minneapolis.

Gordon was born Sept. 18, 1936 on a farm in Brantford ND. His schooling was in West Fargo ND and Concordia College, earning his BA in Music and Psychology, singing all four years in the Concordia Choir.

He was associated with several groups such as the National Lutheran Choir and the Dale Warland Singers. He was director of the Nordkap Male Chorus and Assistant Director of the Norwegian Singers Association of America for the Sangerfests held in 2000, 2002, and 2004.

Gordon was preceded in death by his parents and one brother David. He is survived by his wife Mary; children Laurie (Tom) Rejzer, Linda (John) Mc Donough, Diane (Dan) Hinderaker, and Erik (Susan); nine grandsons; two sisters and two brothers.

His funeral was held May 16th at Central Lutheran Church, in Minneapolis. Burial was at Austin MN.

Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association Sangerfest 2017

The Pacific Coast Norwegian Singers Association held its 108th annual Sangerfest in San Diego, California on June 22-24, 2017. The event was hosted by the San Diego Mannskor at the Crowne Plaza Hotel. The San Diego Mannskor previously hosted PCNSA Sangerfests in 1997 and 2015.

Over three days, 65 singers from 10 choruses, along with family members and friends, renewed friendships, enjoyed performances by individual choruses, socialized over luncheons and dinners, participated in the annual business meeting, and attended the Grand Concert of the combined choruses.

The Grand Concert included 15 choral selections and was directed by Director-in-Chief Paul Thomas May and Assistant Director-in-Chief Peter Butler, with Lyle Johnson and Dr. Alf Knudsen each directing one piece. All of the solos were performed by member singers of the PCNSA; piano accompaniment was by Dr. Jeff Highland. The Pacific Sound Brass Quintet provided accompaniment to õEternal Father, Strong to Saveö and õLandkjenningö and entertained the singers and audience members with a

rousing õintermezzo.ö Another highlight of the evening was the premier of õDance to the Sun,ö with words by Lyle Johnson, a second-generation member of the Thorsmen Chorus of Salem, Oregon, and set to the tune of a *bruremarsi*.

Sangerfest 2017 was the last appearance by Paul Thomas May with the PCNSA. Paul served as Director of the San Diego Mannskor while pursuing degrees at San Diego State University. During these years, Paul also directed the massed PCNSA choruses as both Assistant Directorin-Chief and as Director-in-Chief. Paul graduated in June 2017 with his Masters in Music, will be married in the summer of 2017, and then will relocate to Cleveland, Ohio. members of the PCNSA will miss Pauløs youthful musical leadership and offer best wishes to Paul and Elizabeth in their future endeavors.

HISTORY NOTES

Luren member Lee Grippen recently received two articles of research from a LaCrosse WI source, telling about a person who was also part of Lurenøs early history. The following is gleaned from these articles.

Dubbed the õsilver-toned tenor of the Northwest,ö Norwegian immigrant Emil Berg came to LaCrosse in 1869. He was asked by the President of the Normanna Sangerkor of LaCrosse to lead the chorus. The group wanted to advance in their musical studies, so they needed more professional leadership. Carl Jackwitz, who had founded the group, persuaded Berg to come from Chicago. The Chorus even paid to move Bergøs family and upholstery business from Chicago to LaCrosse!

Berg directed Normanna Sangerkor from 1869-1874, then came to Decorah, where he became Director of Luren which had organized as a quartet in 1868, and reorganized as a chorus in 1874.. He returned to LaCrosse and directed again until his death in 1894.

During Bergos directorship, the group took part in at least two concerts with the famous Norwegian violinist Ole Bull. In May 1872 they joined forces for a concert at Madison in the State Assembly Chambers to raise funds to start a õNorwegian Libraryö at the University of Wisconsin.

At that concert, Normanna sang Sönner av Norge, Brudefærden and Scalders Blomma. The Wisconsin State Journal said õThe Normanna Sangkor (sic) of LaCrosseí is said to be the best choir of Norwegian singers

in Americaí It consists of 12 male voices.ö

While Berg was in Decorah, the LaCrosse chorus suspended activity. Eventually it became a singing group within the larger Norden Society. Over time a rival Norwegian singing group calling themselves the LaCrosse Norske Sangerkor evolved; it met on the North side of LaCrosse. Finally Berg invited the North Side group to join the Normanna Sangerkor in order for LaCrosse to have a strong showing at the 1890 National Sangerfest in Minneapolis.

The Director of the North Side group was Erik B. Rynning, who became the director of the combined chorus after Bergøs death in 1890.


The LaCrosse chorus hosted one Sangefest, held in Myrick Park in 1906 with õProfessorö Eivind O. Forseth at the baton. It was the largest Sangerfest held up to that point.

In April 1903 a fire resulted in loss of the group a records and regalia that had been stored on he 3rd floor of the Norden Hall where the group met.

Nevertheless the Normanna Sangerkor celebrated its 40th Anniversary in 1909 and sang Songs of Norway, arranged by I R. Hald; *Tonens Maft* by Reissinger; *Sigurd Jorsalsfar* and *Nørronnafolket* by Grieg; *Ulabrand* by Wendelborg; and *Landkjending* by Grieg.

That 40th Anniversary celebration was held in Germania Hall, the home of German social and cultural life. The two groups did collaborate on a few other occasions.

õProfessor Forseth died in 1953. In spite of efforts to regroup, it did not, so Normanna disbanded ca 1954.

Emil Berg was born at Trondhjem, Norway Dec. 12, 1843. His father was a military officer; his mother was of Swedish ancestry, but born in Norway. He had a reputation for musical gifts before emigrating in 1866. He settled in Chicago and that fall organized the Nora Society, the first Norwegian musical organization in that city.

Berg was married in LaCrosse to Ella Ranber (or Ella Randine Ranberg). She, one son Ebba (1872-1947) and two daughters, Ragna (1875- after 1911) and Nora (1878-1937) were survivors at his death in May 1890. A 17-day old baby also is buried with the parents.
