After serving as student pastor Mindekirken in the 1980¢s, he was appointed as Director of The Norwegian Glee Club of Minneapolis.

At the fall of the Soviet Union, Haug and his wife Janna were sent as ELCA missionaries to Latvia. During his three years in Riga, he sang with University of Latvia Male Chorus Gaudeamus. Returning to USA, he once again resumed directing the Glee Club.

In the late 1990¢s, his family was sent again to Eastern Europe. This time to Lithuania. Haug¢s professional career would bring him back and forth to Europe over the next 15 years. ORIGINS OF THE SIOUX VALLEY SINGERS ASSOCIATION

Translation of an article written in 1914 by Martin Bergh (John Kvidal- translator)

The Big Sioux River flows along the eastern side of South Dakota from north to south for about three hundred miles. The southern hundred miles forms the boundary between South Dakota on the west and Minnesota and Iowa on the east. On both sides of the valley are some of .the most fertile and richest land in the west. Knowledgeable agronomists claim that certain parts of the valley have the best farmland in the world.

Scandinavians, Norwegians for the most part, settled here by the thousands. We find some who own some of the largest and richest farms in the land and the towns with prosperous teemed businessmen and workers nationalities. Scandinavian Aberdeen, SD lays a little northwest of the source of the Big Sioux while Watertown is the northern most town by its shore. A hundred miles south the river meanders through Sioux Falls, the stateøs largest city.

Twenty miles farther south is Canton, the most Norwegian city in South Dakota and almost a hundred miles south the Big Sioux empties into the mighty Missouri by Sioux City, Iowa. Madison SD is 40 miles to the northwest of Sioux Falls and is perhaps the next most Norwegian town. In southern direction from Sioux City is Fort Dodge IA and directly west in the state of Nebraska is the great City of Omaha.

Norwegian and Scandinavian societies singing have been organized in these towns since the 1890's with the exception of Watertown SD, and their work is well known among the singers associations in America. Northwest Singers' Association has several times held its festival in Sioux Falls and Sioux City. Omaha has also held these big meetings in The fine prize previous years. banner is now owned and preserved by the Minnehaha Mandskor of Sioux Falls. This banner has been the object of struggles at several of these meetings.

Interest in music and song has grown from the heavy workdays of the immigrants to the more leisurely opportunities of the present. A national gathering every other year did not satisfy these eager and enthusiastic singers: They wanted to meet more often. There arose a merger of those choruses drawn together by geography and neighborhood.

One of the last associations organized was the Sioux Valley Norwegian Singers Association which included singing societies in the towns mentioned above in

South Dakota. Nebraska and Iowa.

On the trip home from the national sanqertest in Fargo (ND) in 1912 the idea to organize a district chorus arose among the Sioux Falls Singers which would be composed of societies in the Sioux Valley area

On April 9,1913, the Minnehaha' Mandskordirector called meeting of delegates in Canton (SD). The association included the following three societies: Normendennes Sangforening (now Nordic Male Chorus) Sioux City (IA), Minnehaha Mandskor, -Sioux Falls(SD) and Grieg Sangforening ,Canton (SD). NOR of Omaha (NE) was 'later admitted. Wick was elected Director-in-Chief.

Adopted at the same, meeting resolution a to hold sangerfests every other vear beginning in, 1913 with the first to be held in Sioux City (IA) on August 27,1913. The meeting was successful in all respects although the Sioux City singers could not find any money in their treasury but they took it with good humor and hoped to fill it all the same. They managed to fill it shortly after.

The joint chorus, about 125 men, sang its numbers brilliantly, wrote Sanger-Hilsen editor (Theodore Hamann) in the addition after the fest. Director-in-chief Wick who also directed the orchestra, smiled the whole evening. "Naar Fjordene Blanner," "Landkjending" and "Den Store Hvide Flok" were sung movingly and repeat numbers' were forbidden for the choruses. One

does not hear such soloists as Mr. Chris Dahl every day and he was strongly applauded each time he sang a solo.

Grieg's solo number was "Ulabrand" by Wendelberg. The Canton men, directed by Mannerud of Sioux Falls, consisted of 24 men of whom the majority had sung together since its organization twenty years previous (1892)

The audience waited with considerable suspense to hear the "NOR Forening" from Omaha. While the chorus was relatively young it was also experienced. They performed quite handsomely in "Brudefarden.ö Axel Hauge directed.

Minnehaha Mandskor from Sioux Falls came, saw and The house stood as conquered. one after the singing of Adamøs "Comrades in Armsö and wanted more. Although an English composition, it was sung to stormy applause. What was admired about the chorus was not so much the fine intonation and choral singing, but the difficult and rapid tempo was amazingly certain. twenty minutes to sing these choruses did not sway the singers for a moment. Carl Mannerud directed the chorus.

Normendenes Singing Society (now the Nordic Male Chorus) of Sioux City came forward again after singing Haarlklou's "Varde." It was directed by N.S. Orninggaard. The well mannered chorus had many fine voices.
