James Arthur Gulbranson, 80, passed away Friday, February 10, 2023, at Sanford Medical Center in Sioux Falls SD following an extended post-surgical stay.

ORIGINS OF THE SIOUX VALLEY SINGERS ASSOCIATION

(continuation of 1914 article from p. 11 of Sept.-Dec. 2022 issue)

The singers marched to the Martin Hotel after the concert where the banquet room was bathed in streams of light-and a host of servers stood prepared . Each time a chorus was to be served the head waiter motioned for the servers to come forward in one - two-three Bismarkian precision. It was certainly a delightful show

President Chris Dahl introduced the evening's chairman, O. E. Jacobson, who allowed the diners to finish eating before he began. It was quite late before the eloquent Norwegian Consul, Sigurd O.

Hanger, of Sioux Falls was called upon as a first speaker

Next came the Sanger-Hilsen's editor (Theodore Hamann) who gave an overview of male chorus history in the last twenty-five years. He received a favorable response and aroused much interest.

Several others also spoke including Fred Wick, Martin Arnstan of Sioux Falls, P.A Sorum of Canton and Axel Hauge of Omaha.

Telegrams were read from Dovre Singing Society in Minneapolis and Emil Biorn of Chicago. A letter of good wishes for the new association was read from O.M. Oleson of Fort Dodge. In conclusion the Sioux Falls and Canton Singers sang a new composition "MOR" by Fred Wick with text by Haldor Greguson of Canton.

Preparations are being made for the next sangerfest in August 1915, and it is hoped that the joint chorus will number about 200 men. Officials for the sangerfest were to be Martin Bergh, President; J.A. Jacobson, Vice President and H.E. Munkvold, Secretary

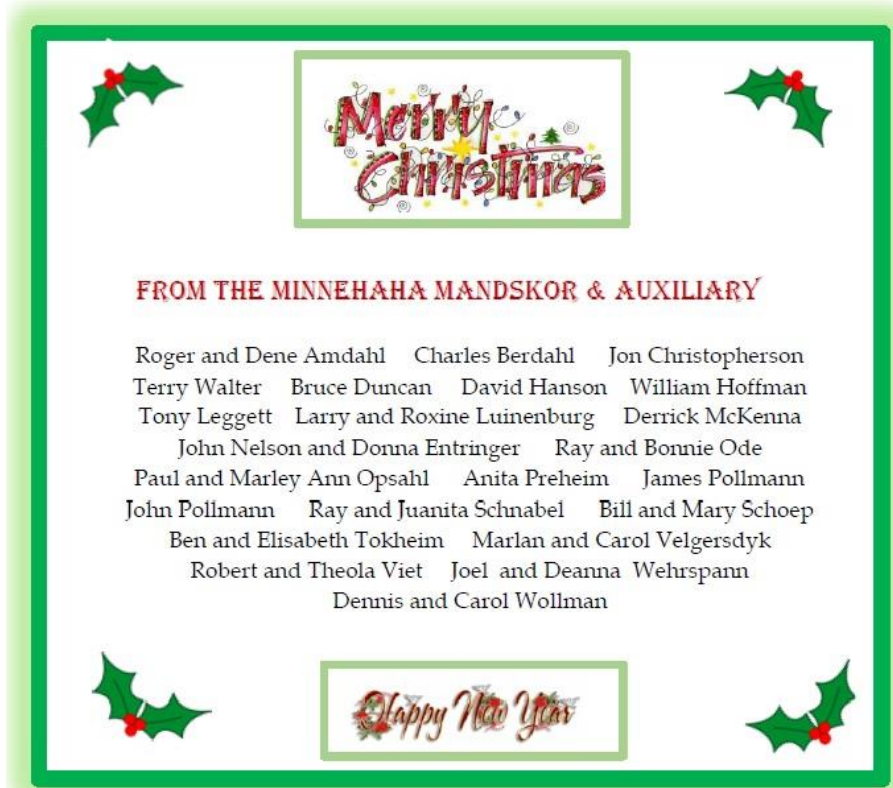
